Educating communities that live with Asian elephants



Australia Zoo Wildlife Warriors supports two on-the-ground elephant conservation programs - the Conservation Response Units (CRUs) in Sumatra, and the Cambodian Elephant Conservation Group (CEGG) in Cambodia. Both of these programs help tackle issues elephants face in the wild, working with and engaging local communities by giving them the tools and knowledge required to live alongside the elephant.

Defending the last remaining Sumatran orangutans



Australia Zoo Wildlife Warriors works with the Orangutan Protection Units (OPUs) and their rehabilitation and release of rescued orangutans in Bukit Tigapuluh National Park, Sumatra. The OPUs patrol the National Park, helping to put a stop to illegal conversion of habitat to plantations such as palm oil, forest destruction and poaching.

Saving cheetah in South Africa



Australia Zoo Wildlife Warriors works in partnership with organisations engaged in cheetah conservation in South Africa. We work together with these organisations on cheetah releases, tracking and monitoring of cheetah, educating locals to reduce the human-cheetah conflict, and the Anatolian Shepherd Livestock Guarding Dog Program, which has been set up by Cheetah Outreach.

Other wildlife conservation projects



In addition, Australia Zoo Wildlife Warriors is engaged in vital conservation and research with Tasmanian devils, whales and on the Steve Irwin Wildlife Reserve.

Funding the life saving work of the Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital



Located near Australia Zoo, the Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital was opened in March 2004, inspired by the memory of Lyn Irwin (Steve Irwin’s mum), who was a pioneer in wildlife care in Queensland. The hospital is currently Australia’s largest and busiest wildlife hospital (after a new facility was opened on Steve Irwin Day, 15 November 2008), treating thousands of animals every year at no cost to the public. Our motto is “save one, save the species”.

Protecting the last 400 Sumatran tigers



Australia Zoo Wildlife Warriors is setting up and maintaining the Tiger Conservation and Protection Units (TCPUs) in Kerinci Seblat National Park, Sumatra. The TCPUs are the most successful tiger law enforcement program in southeast Asia, putting a stop to illegal activities such as poaching and illegal logging in and around the National Park.
